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Printing from Library's Workstations Now Available

Library users can now print from the Library's workstations. The long awaited installation of the necessary software was completed this month.

To thank our users for their patience, printing and copying will be free through the end of September.

Beginning on October 1st, printing and copying will again be charged at the rate of 10¢ per page. At that time, users must have a Library account set up to print from the three patron workstations. The account will be password protected and allow the user to prepay for printing and photocopying in the Library. Printing and copying charges will automatically be deducted from the balance in the attorney's account as prints and copies are made.

The initial deposit required when setting up an account is \$5.00. Accounts will not operate if the balance falls to zero, so they cannot have a negative balance. The Library will not charge printing and photocopying to be billed later.

Accounts will be available 24/7 to all users who have been issued Library keys.

To set up a printing/copying account, please contact the Library as soon as possible.
